Necessary documents for import to France

- ✓ Destination informations
- √ Copy of passport
- ✓ Inventory of used household goods with values expressed <u>in euros</u>, dated and signed, for customs
- ✓ Inventory of used household goods with values expressed in <u>Canadian</u> dollars, dated and signed for insurance
- ✓ Proof of residence in France. If you do not have a residence in France and
 if are staying with family or friends, the welcoming person has to write a
 letter certifying that he will lodge you. A recent copy of an electricity /
 telephone invoice must accompany the letter.
- ✓ Declaration of "non-cession"

For French citizens

✓ Original certificate of "change of residence", stating that you stayed more than one year in Canada, signed by the French Consulate in Montreal

For non French citizens

✓ A letter from your employer in France, with his full name and address, stating that you will be working in France and that you have been in Canada for more than a year.

WARNING

- Required documents are very important. Customs in France can be very strict, and storage at the port can be costly, so it is necessary to have a complete file for quick clearance.
- Please note that used household goods are duty free if they have been in the owner's possession and utilization for at least 6 months.
